DEFINITE ARTICLES

Act; 9: Definite articles is a fancy way to say the word “the” in Spanish. “The” is “the” in English. In Spanish, there are 4 ways to say “the” (el, la, los, las)

The word “the” in Spanish is determined by Masculine, Feminine, Singular and Plural. If the word is:

- Masculine and Singular, the= el
- Feminine and Singular, the = la
- Masculine and Plural, the = los
- Feminine and Plural, the = las

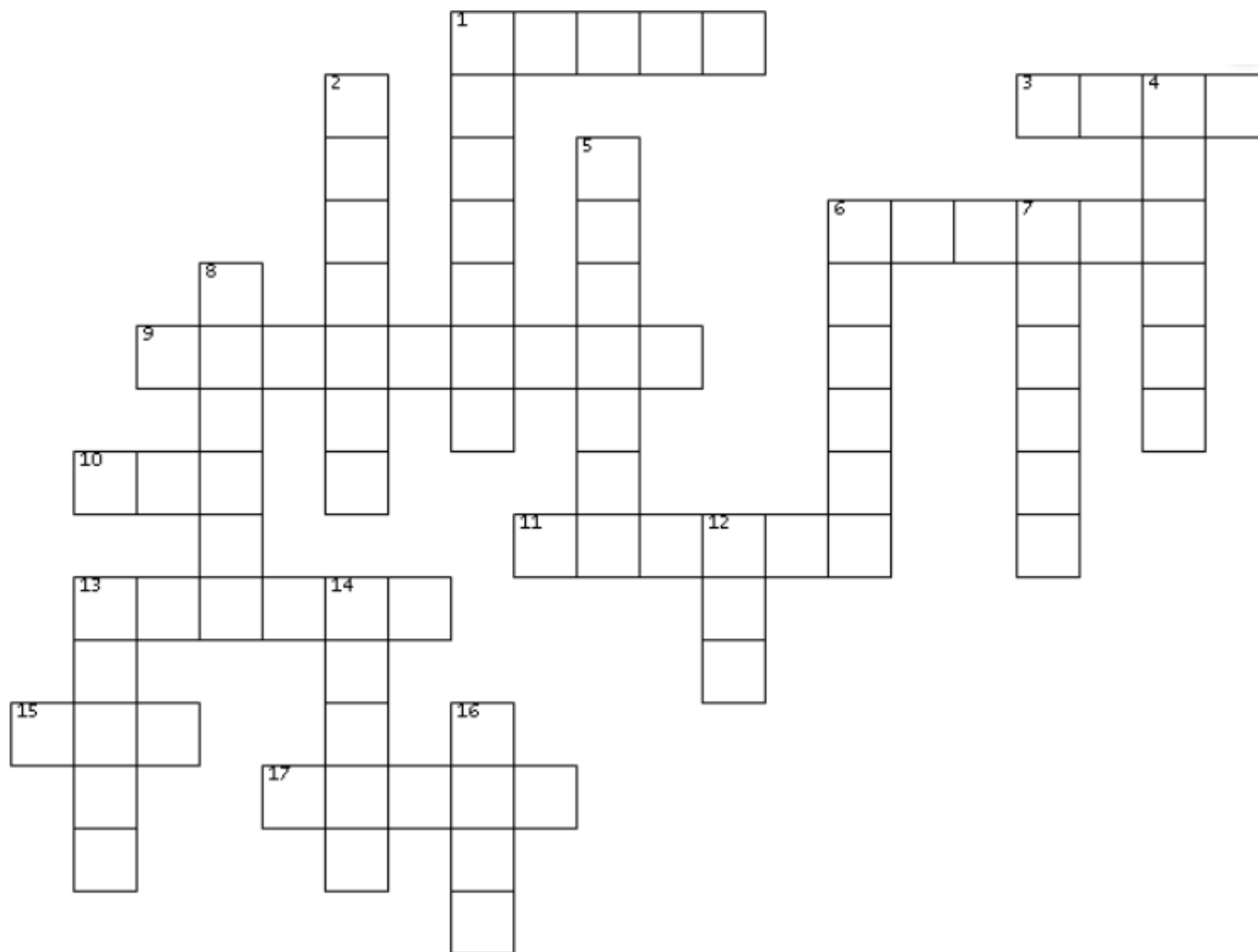
