# THE POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVES

- The Possessive Adjectives are words that explain to whom the noun or object belongs too. It shows ownership. In English we have the words (my, your, his, her, its, our, their, and yours (plural)). In Spanish the equivalent to:
- My= mi, mis
- Your = tu, tus
- His = su, sus
- Her= su, sus
- Your (formal) = su, sus
- Its = su, sus
- Our= nuestro, nuestra, nuestros, nuestras
- Your (Pl. Spain) = vuestro, vuestra, vuestros, vuestras
- Their = su, sus
- Their (fem) = su, sus
- Your (Plural) = su, sus

- Except for “our”, all of the rest of the Possessive Adjectives are determined by Singular or Plural. For “our” the Possessive Adjectives are determined by Masculine or feminine and Singular or Plural.

As you remember from a previous lesson, if the last letter of a singular noun ends in L,O,N,E,R,S there is a 97% chance that the word is Masculine.

- And, if the last letter of a singular noun ends in D,ión,Z,A there is a 98% chance that the word is feminine.
