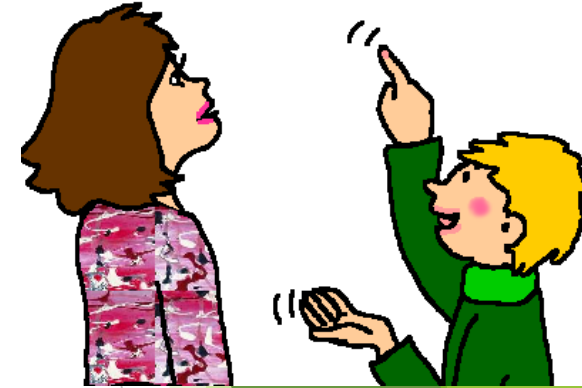

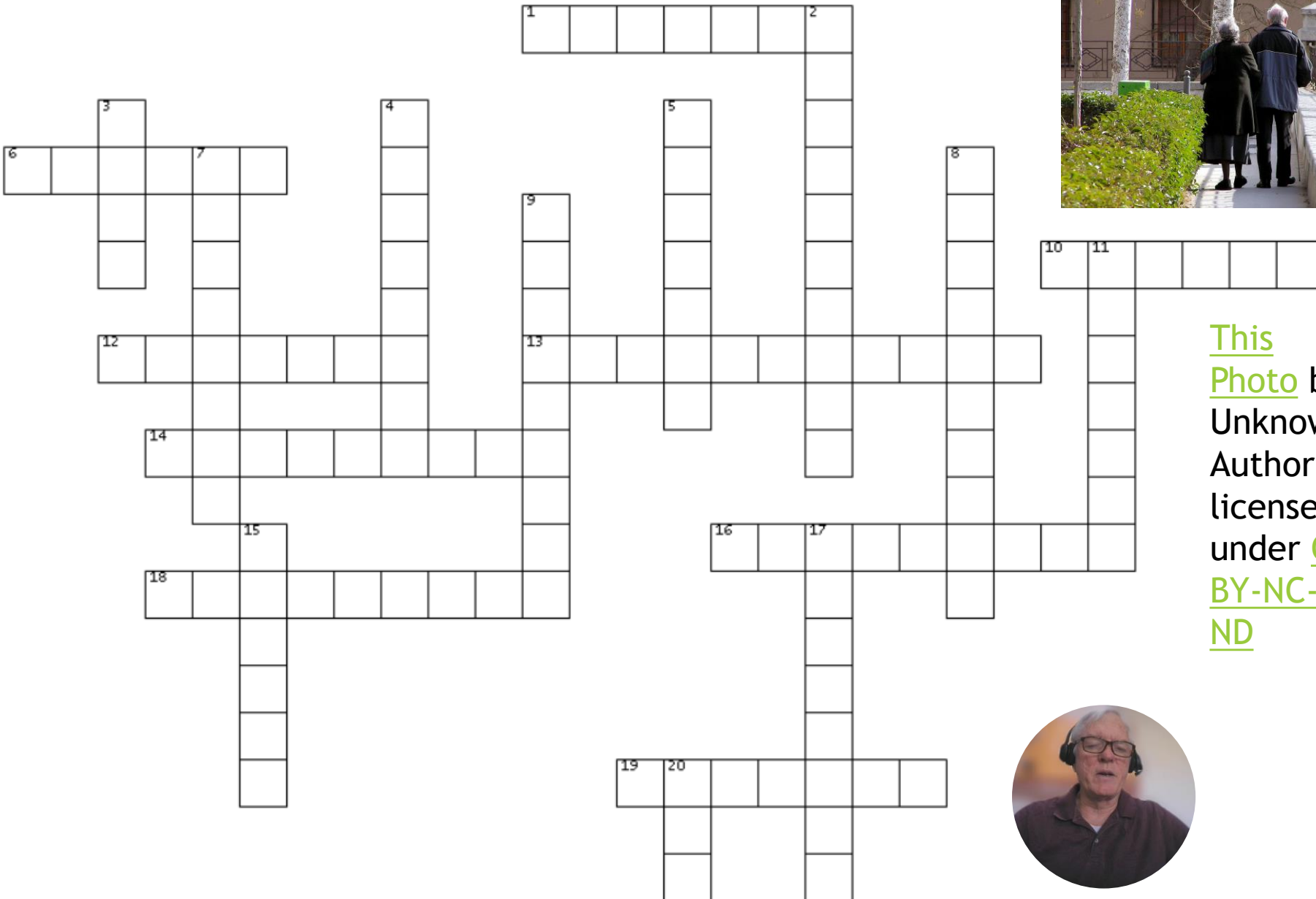

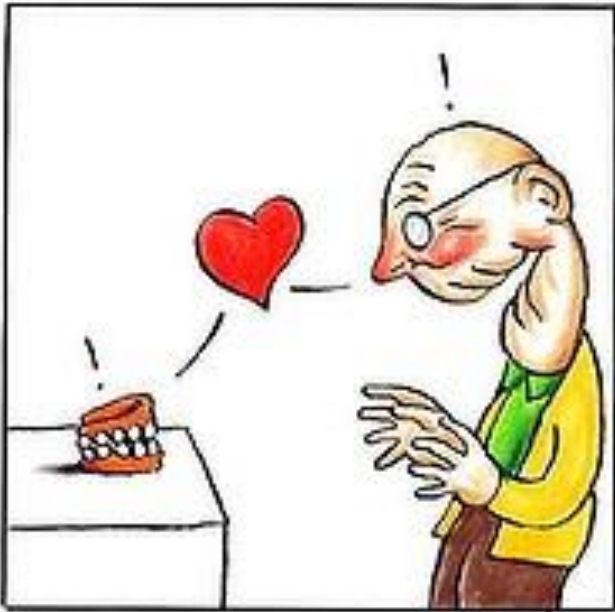

5. Learn travel vocabulary about exotic places, holidays, and culture.
